CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Civil Construction is well underway across Lyndarum North with a contractor awarded for Stages 1-6 and a new signalised Edgars Rd & Craigieburn Rd intersection. These works incorporate over 380 residential allotments in our new community, 12km of kerb & channel, 8Km of drainage, 5km of new water mains and over 2,500 truckloads of concrete for footpaths, cycle links, driveways and new laneways.

If you have driven past on Craigieburn Rd past Lyndarum North, you will have noticed the number of trucks, excavators and activity shaping our new community. Stages 1 and 2 civil works are now well advanced with completion estimated to be during Spring 2018. The AVJennings team is excited to see the progress made on the early construction phase of Lyndarum North. With over 350 lot sales since our Stage 1 release, it will be amazing to see the transformation of the site into our new Lyndarum North community over the next 12 months and to seeing the first homes being built later in the year.

Autumn Recipe

Warm veggie salad with lime and pepper haloumi

Not only is autumn the perfect time to soak up those last few warm days before winter sets in, it's also a great opportunity to experiment with warm salads using beautifully roasted vegetables. This Autumn veggie salad with haloumi cheese uses a variety of vegetables that are at their best in the colder months and is ideal as either a precursor to a hearty lunch or dinner, or as a meal, all on its own.

Ingredients

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 2 crushed garlic cloves
- 2 bunches mini asparagus, trimmed
- 1 red capsicum cut into 2cm-wide strips
- 2 small zucchini, peeled into ribbons
- 180g haloumi, cut into 5mm-thick slices
- 2 tablespoons lime juice
- ¼ cup (40g) toasted pine nuts
- Lime wedges

Method

1. Heat up barbecue or grill on high.
2. Mix oil and garlic in a bowl and add seasoning.
3. Mix the asparagus and capsicum with half of the oil mixture.
4. Cook asparagus and capsicum on the grill for 3 – 4 minutes or until lightly charred, put on plate and cover to keep warm.
5. Mix the zucchini with the remaining oil mixture, then grill for 2 – 3 minutes or until lightly charred, put on plate and cover to keep warm.
6. Grill haloumi for 1 – 2 minutes on each side or until golden.
7. Place asparagus, capsicum, and zucchini on a platter. Drizzle with lime juice and sprinkle pine nuts. Top with haloumi and garnish with lime wedges.

AUTUMN GARDENING TIPS

Autumn is a great time to get outside into the garden and to tackle all those DIY projects you've been putting off, before winter hits and we retreat indoors until September. Get your gardening gloves on and your green thumbs out with these tips to help your backyard thrive.

1 - Mulch

While the word itself may be decidedly unattractive, the effect it has on the garden is anything but. Mulching will help soil retain its moisture, and eventually it breaks down to provide extra nutrients for plant life.

2 - Plant bulbs

Having your garden look like it belongs in a fairy tale in spring is easy if you do the right planting over winter. With a wide array of colours, varieties, and species of bulbs available, there are absolutely no limits to what you can create. Ample sunlight is just about the only requirement for growing these bright spring time blooms.

3 - Prune

Provided you know what you're doing, pruning trees has tremendous benefits for their health and appearance. Following a hot, dry summer, your plants will benefit hugely from a few well-placed snips and trims, from which new growth will sprout in the spring.

4 - Tend to your lawn

Autumn is a great time to feed the lawn with a slow-release food as the soil is still warm and roots still be growing at a healthy rate. Fertilising is also a good option as this can help to protect your precious grass over the colder months.

5 - Garlic

This hardy little flavour enhancer has more benefits than meets the eye. It is a natural pest repellent which can prove hugely beneficial when growing other fruits or vegetables. In addition, this is the sort of plant that you put in the ground and leave to flourish on its own - the perfect first-time crop for all you aspiring veggie patch growers.
