Title and construction update.

A summary of our key updates:

- Landscaping to streets in Stages 4-9 is now complete.
- Landscaping to streets in Stage 10 has commenced.
- Settlements of our second release of Emerald Townhomes are anticipated for mid-2022.
- Coral Stage 11 construction is nearing completion with kerb and channel work including concrete paths and driveways now complete and topsoiling underway. Titles are anticipated in late 2021/early 2022.
- Bulk earthworks are complete on our Jewel Stage 12 release and sewer and drainage works are nearing completion.
- Stage 13 construction is underway with Stage 14 to commence in December 2021.

6 tips for a low maintenance garden.

High-quality landscaping helps to enhance the look and feel of our homes, streetscapes and community, while also protecting and adding value to your investment.

The team at Lyndarum North understands that not all homeowners have the time to spend hours tending to their plants, and so having a garden that's both beautiful and low maintenance is important.

If you're in need of some guidance to create lush and low maintenance landscapes for your home, here are some top tips:

1. Opt for natives

Australian natives are the best and easiest plants to grow in your garden. This is because they're equipped to handle the local conditions and don't require much maintenance.



Native plants also come in a beautiful array of colours and sizes, so your garden will be both low maintenance and eye-catching.

Some of our favourite native plants include:

- Australian daisy (Brachyscome)
- Bird's next fern (Asplenium australasicum)
- Bottlebrush (Callistemon)
- Grevillea
- Lomandra (Lomandra longifolia)
- White correa (Correa alba)

2. Choose climbers

Climbing plants require relatively little upkeep while providing lushness and greenery. They also make beautiful wall features if you want to maximise entertaining space and reduce garden beds in your backyard.

3. Ditch the lawn

Instead of filling your flat areas with turf, create beautiful features with other materials like decking, paving, gravel or sand. This could save you hours of mowing!

If you love the look of a lush lawn but want to keep it low maintenance, you can opt for artificial turf or slow growing grasses, like Zoysia.

4. Add in some pot plants

Featuring pot plants around your front and rear gardens is a great way to integrate greenery without worrying about weeding and garden bed upkeep. Plus, they're easy to replace if you decide to change them. You can also buy pot plants that are already quite established, so you won't need to tend to them as they reach maturity.

5. Integrate outdoor living

Let's face it, less plants means less maintenance. One way to reduce the amount of garden care while keeping your backyard looking beautiful is to create a seamless outdoor entertainment area. Whether you choose decking, concrete or tiles, having a designated space to sit outdoors, entertain and relax is a great way to enjoy your garden without the hassle.

6. Think groundcover

Choosing plants that will reduce water usage and stop weeds growing is a great way to minimise garden maintenance – plus they look so much prettier than mulch!

Some great groundcover plants include:

- Grevillea 'Bronze Rambler or 'Poorinda Royal Mantle'
- Myoporum parvifolium
- Cerastium tomentosum
- Scaevola aemula

2021 Community grant recipients.

At Lyndarum North we believe local groups and organisations are integral to the fabric of our community. With this in mind, we established our Community Grants Program with the aim of reinforcing our support for the significant work these groups undertake within the Whittlesea community.

We are thrilled to announce the successful recipients of the 2021 program and the fantastic projects this funding will go towards.



Whittlesea Community Connections (WCC) is a local, independent and community-led organisation that provides a range of free and confidential support services and programs for those in need. WCC will utilise the grant funding for information sessions and workshops for people in the local area.

Whittlesea Bicycle Users Group

The Whittlesea Bicycle Users Group organise social rides for cyclists of all skill levels. Rides are held regularly on Sunday, including twilight rides in Summer. Whittlesea BUG also organise classes and workshops to educate cyclists on basic bicycle repair skills and cycling skills. Whittlesea BUG will be using their grant funding for training programs aimed at women and teenager girls.

Lalor Landcare

Lalor Landcare is an urban based 'Landcare' Group. The principal activities of the group are litter collection, revegetation work and (in the future) wildlife surveys and nesting box placement. Lalor Landcare will utilise the grant to source seeds from extant River Red Gum trees at Lyndarum/Lyndarum North that will be nurtured into small trees and planted along the banks of Edgars Creek.



Edgars Creek Primary School

Edgars Creek Primary School is a newly established primary school in the suburb of Wollert. The school operates in learning communities which means students have a homegroup teacher and work with numerous teachers in their community for different subjects. Wellbeing is their main focus. The school's motto is 'Learning together for success.' The school plans to use the grant funding to:

- Set-up new clubs for children to collaborate and learn
- Purchase new toys that are essential for learning and development

Creeds Farm and Learning Centre

Creeds Farm Living and Learning Centre is a local Neighbourhood House that works with a range of communities; particularly those who are socially isolated, experiencing disadvantage or domestic violence. Creeds Farm and Learning Centre will use the funding to run social activities for a Connecting Women Group.

Northside Muslim Circle

Northside Muslim Circle was formed in response to a need for engagement, connection and services for the growing Muslim community in the northern suburbs of Melbourne, particularly in the City of Whittlesea. Northside Muslim Circle will use the grant to hire a venue for meetings.

Wollert and District Fire Brigade

Wollert District Fire Brigade is a 100% volunteer fire brigade made up of local community members committed to protecting lives and properties since 1942 through emergency response and fire safety education. Wollert and District Fire Brigade will use the grant to construct a much needed hose drying tower.

Epping Little Athletics Club

Epping Little Athletics Club was established in 1980. It is a progressive club that promotes the Little Athletics values of Fun, Family, Fitness and being your BEST. It's not all about winning. It's about making new friends in the local community and being part of a Team. Epping LAC will use the funding to purchase training equipment for volunteers and sporting equipment for athletes.

Splash around at Whittlesea swim centre

Whittlesea Swim Centre's GOswim Swimming and Water Safety School Holiday Program runs during the summer school holidays. The program is open to all ages and helps students work on their swimming technique and water safety skills while enjoying fun activities.

Lessons will run from Monday 10th January – Friday 14th January, and students will take part in a daily 30-minute session between 9am and 12pm. Students will also have unlimited swimming access before or after their lesson.

The program is free for current GOswim members and \$66.50 for non-members. Whittlesea Swim Centre is a 22-minute drive from Lyndarum North.

Alternatively, head to Whittlesea Swim Centre from 9am – 6pm daily to simply enjoy their swimming facilities, including a 25m main pool, learner's pool, toddler pool, splash pad and waterslide.

Salt dough ornaments

Using your child's hand and footprint, you can create these keepsake Santa and Reindeer salt dough ornaments. The lovely thing about this is that when you get out the ornaments every year you can see how much their hand or foot size has grown!

Here's what you'll need for your salt dough ornament recipe:

Ribbon

• Acrylic paint

Paintbrushes

Ingredients

- 11/2 cups plain flour
- 1/2 cup fine table salt
- 1 tbsp vegetable oil
- 2/3 cup chilled water

Directions

Step 1

Preheat oven to 120°C.

Line 2 baking trays with baking paper. Mix flour and salt in a bowl. Make a well in the centre. Pour in oil. Gradually add water, stirring mixture with a wooden spoon until combined. Turn dough onto a lightly floured surface. Knead to make a smooth ball.

Step 2

Roll dough out between 2 sheets baking paper until 1 cm thick. Use hand or foot to create an impression in the dough. Use a chopstick or skewer to make a hole at the top of each decoration. Place decorations on trays. Roll remaining dough together and repeat.

Step 3

Bake decorations for 2 1/2 hours or until firm and dry. Transfer to a wire rack to cool completely.

Step 4

Paint front and sides. Allow paint to dry. Paint a second coat. While top-coat is wet, sprinkle with glitter. Allow to dry. Paint back of decorations with 2 coats. Thread ribbon through holes. Hang on Christmas tree.



It's time to channel your creative vibes with a couple of easy and fun Christmas activity ideas!

No bake reindeer cookies

Ingredients

- 150g cooking chocolate
- 1 packet of plain biscuits (oval shape – Arnott's milk Arrowroot biscuits are good)
- 1 × box of Tiny Teddies
- 1 packet of Strawberry Creams
- White Chocolate Chips
- Black or brown edible icing pen
- Or substitute the chocolate chips and edible pen for candy eyes.



Instructions

- 1. Melt the chocolate in a pan. 150g of chocolate covers approximately 1 packet of 31 biscuits.
- $2.\mbox{Spread}$ the melted chocolate over the biscuits.
- 3. Add the Strawberry Creams for the eindeer's nose and press gently into the chocolate.
- 4. Use two tiny teddy biscuits for each Reindeer. Turn them over and use as the antlers, again pressing gently into the chocolate.
- 5. Add 2 white chocolate chips for the eyes.
- 6. In the middle of the white chocolate chips, use the icing pen to leave the reindeer's pupil.
- 7. If you prefer you can use edible candy eyes instead of white chocolate chips for the eyes.
